Our family vision and a the goals of MTCF in Afghanistan is to create a young generation that grows up with science and technology, as my grandfather Sardar Mahmud Tarzi pointed out. As the grandchildren of Mahmud Tarzi, we established the "Mahmud Tarzi Culture Foundation - MTCF" in Afghanistan and we provide educational opportunities to our youth. We also carry out joint studies by establishing very close relations with international institutes and associations dealing with these issues. In this regard we supported to build a new school building with 16 class-room in Mahmud Tarzi High school at Kabul. The foundation was established in Kabul in 2005 within the framework of Afghan laws.

It has representative offices in Istanbul, Geneva, Kassel and New York. The purpose of the foundation; to contribute to Afghan youth and women in the fields of education and culture, to provide scholarships and also to carry out international studies to keep the name of Mahmud Tarzi alive. The primary goals of the foundation are to provide scholarships to high school and university students, organize seminars, forums, conferences, and prepare social aid organizations within certain programs. We would like to thank our friends and associations for their financial and moral support to the work of our foundation.
